#### FEBRUARY SERVICE ACTIVITY – LWR LENT BASKETS OF PROMISE:

Resurrection Lutheran will be collecting items to complete personal care kits. In places like Guatemala, water-borne illnesses prey on children. Education is essential in escaping the cycle of poverty. Personal Care kits teach students to stay healthy so they can thrive. This Lenten season, as our congregation journeys toward the cross, let us also walk with people in need. LWR Personal Care Kits offer simple tools that give an extraordinary gift - the preservation of one's God-given dignity and staying healthy for a "future with hope." (Jeremiah 29:11) Please feel free to donate individual items if you do not want to do an entire kit. Or, donate the items and we'll put them together for you. Items needed include the following:

- \* One bath-size towel (approx. 52" x 27"), dark color
- \* Two bath-size bars (4-5 oz.) of soap, in original wrapping
- \* One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging (no toothpaste)
- \* One sturdy comb, remove packaging
- \* One metal nail clipper, remove packaging

All items should be new. Wrap items in towel and tie securely with ribbons or yarn. Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags. Each kit costs \$2.65 to ship. If you are interested in helping with shipping or for more information, contact Joanne Gallagher at 727-1014.
