### THREE DAYS OF PRAYER

For any and all that could come -

- 7:00 pm on Tues, Jan. 8th, Wed, Jan. 9th, and Thurs, Jan. 10th
- Come together for a prayer time at RLCA for about 30 minutes each night.

Let's take this time to lay our mistakes, grudges, resentments, anger, shame and failure at the foot of the cross and then hear God's Word of forgiveness and renewal.

<u>January 9</u> - **Day of Petition** - to pray for those in the Body of Christ with personal needs, for health needs, for current and future ministries. We are to bring every concern and care to God and pray for those serving in volunteer or paid ministries, for people on the mission field and for those Christians who are persecuted because of Jesus.

<u>January 10</u> – **Day of Invitation** - to invite the work of the Holy Spirit to breathe fresh and new life into the church across the world. LCMC is an international association of congregations and we can pray with and for our international partners well at the same time the United States of America is now the greatest mission field with a growing percentage of people with no familiarity with Christianity. There is much spiritual interest, but very little interest in being part of a group of believers. Let us pray for interest in the Savior, Jesus, and for renewal and revival for those who are loosely affiliated with the church. We need to be light in the darkness and salt in a tasteless life and a real and abiding hope for those who live with deep despair. Can't make it to church: Pray at home, any time, each of these days.
